The leader begins by making the Sign of the Cross with those present

Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew

Prayers of Petition.

The leader or someone present reads aloud

Let us pray in solidarity for our brothers and sisters here and around the world who are sick. Let us pray also for those who have lost loved ones to this virus. May God console them and grant them peace.

We Pray to the Lord

And those present respond aloud:

“Lord Hear our Prayer”

We pray also for doctors, nurses, and caregivers, for public health officials and all civic leaders. May God grant them courage and prudence as they seek to respond to this emergency with compassion and in service to the common good.

We Pray to the Lord

We Pray for the whole Church that is experiencing physical distance from your very presence in the Most holy Eucharist. That our prayers of spiritual communion united with all the church living and deceased, and all angels and saints, renew within us the hope and strength that we received in baptism.

We Pray to the Lord

We Pray for all families and anyone experiencing isolation in this time. God grant to them courage in their fears, hope against despair, spiritual solidarity with the whole Church and a renewal in their call to live the joy of the good news amidst life’s trials.

We pray for those who have gone from this world those who have passed and now stand before you. For all those who have died we ask for a greater outpouring of mercy, that you may welcome them into your heavenly kingdom.

We Pray to the Lord

Litany To Divine Mercy

The leader reads aloud and those present repeat each sentence

Lord, have mercy.

Christ, have mercy.

Lord, have mercy.

Christ, hear us.

Christ, graciously hear us.

Lord Jesus Hear our Prayer.

The leader reads aloud and those present respond aloud, have mercy on us

God, the Father of heaven, have mercy on us.

God, the Son, Redeemer of the world, have mercy on us.

God, the Holy Spirit, have mercy on us.

Holy Trinity, one God, have mercy on us.

Response, we trust in you

Divine Mercy, gushing forth from the bosom of the Father, we trust in You.

Divine Mercy, greatest attribute of God, we trust in You.

Divine Mercy, incomprehensible mystery, we trust in You.

Divine Mercy, gushing forth from the mystery of the Most Blessed Trinity, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, unfathomed by any intellect, human or angelic, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, from which wells forth all life and happiness, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, better than the heavens, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, source of miracles and wonders, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, encompassing the whole universe, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, descending to earth in the Person of the Incarnate Word, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, which flowed out from the open wound of the Heart of Jesus, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, enclosed in the Heart of Jesus for us, and especially for sinners, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, which flowed out from the wounds of Christ, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, giving us the Blessed Virgin Mary as Mother of Mercy, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, in revealing the mysteries of God, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, in the founding of the Holy Church, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, in instituting the Holy Sacraments, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, first of all in the sacraments of Baptism and Penance, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, in the Holy Eucharist and the sacrament of Holy Orders, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, in calling us to the holy faith, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, in the conversion of sinners, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, in sanctifying the just, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, in perfecting of the pious, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, fount of help for the sick and the suffering, *we trust in You.*

Divine Mercy, sweet relief for anguished hearts, *we trust in You.*

Lamb of God, who takes away our sins with inexhaustible compassion, have mercy on us.

The leader reads aloud V:

V: The Mercy of God is above all His works.

Followed by Response of those present

R: Hence, we will praise The Divine Mercy forever and ever.

The leader then reads alone

Let us pray:

Eternal God, in whom mercy is unfathomable and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy, itself¹

All present pray together

Holy Virgin of Guadalupe,
Queen of the Angels and Mother of the Americas.
We fly to you today as your beloved children.
We ask you to intercede for us with your Son,
as you did at the wedding in Cana.

Pray for us, loving Mother,
and gain for our nation and world,
and for all our families and loved ones,
the protection of your holy angels,
that we may be spared the worst of this illness.

For those already afflicted,
we ask you to obtain the grace of healing and deliverance.
